This July, as a part of the global campaign by the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), Peace Boat will hold Hibakusha testimony events to provide opportunities to listen to the first hand stories of atomic bomb survivors. These events will be a space to commemorate the gravity of the suffering of Hibakusha, to remind ourselves of the current nuclear threat, and to discuss possible actions we can take both together and individually. The first day of the series of <u>four</u> events is July 7, which also marks the three-year anniversary of the adoption of the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) at the United Nations. **Registration**: * All events are delivered on Zoom and free of charge. *To participate, please register from the link below.
