ETHEL TOBACH

Ethel Tobach, PhD of Wayland MA spent many of her 94 years as a pacifist and lifelong peace activist. Born in Ukraine, Ethel's family had fled the Russian revolution for Palestine. When her father passed away, her mother brought her as a baby to the US. Ethel spent her career as a researcher and eventually curator of the American Museum of Natural History. She was well known as a tireless crusader for human rights and dignity. Her bequest to WILPF US in 2015 was not huge, but represented a symbol of her lifelong support for peace.



WILMER BRANDT

Wilmer Brandt, 96 of Marshfield VT, was not a rich man and lived very simply as a forester, but his generosity to WILPF was significant in his estate giving plan. He was committed to peace and justice, and was a conscientious objector during World War II. Wilmer participated in Friday Peace vigils in Montpelier and belonged to the Friends Meeting House. Even though he had never earned a huge salary, his generosity to WILPF in 2016 was significant support for ongoing projects.



ETHEL SANJINES

When Ethel passed in 2011 at 97, she was not even a member of WILPF, but she had been active in San Francisco's Women for Peace, which shared an office with WILPF. Her bequest to WILPF through our fiscal sponsor lent stability to WILPF US during times of transition.

HAZEL VIRGINIA EVANS

A 45 year WILPF member from Philadelphia, PA and Woburn, MA left a small bequest to WILPF US. Her family also directed memorials to WILPF, which increased the strength of her legacy.
